

## FFCA October 2014 General Meeting

Meeting came to order at 6pm at the Mountain View Elementary School.

### Business:

Minutes from September meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's Report was read and approved.

The Board approved \$12,000 for lower sections of Kokokahi. Hills to be taken down, easements cleaned, regraveled.

D.Milner request to reduce past due amounts, this was denied.

The resident who lives at the connection between Fern Forest and Eden Rock, at the end of Kaleponi, requested that debris be moved off his property, that the FFCA had used to block the passage of vehicles. The resident had suggested that the FFCA at least make an opening wide enough for motorcycles and ATV's. However, the FFCA decided not to make an opening, especially considering the criminal contingent using these kinds of vehicles.

As it turns out the blockage does not prevent passage. Travelers have pushed through on adjacent properties. This access continues to be a problem because

1. It's such a logical place to connect, making it hard to resist using.
2. Because of its association with a "quick get-away" route, it seems better to keep it non-passable.

The Port-a-potty was stolen. The Road Manager made a police report. The FFCA will take action to rent one in the meantime, as the police report is processed.
